


Obadiah 01:01 The vision of

up against her in battle.


Obadiah 01:02 Behold, I have made

thou art greatly despised.





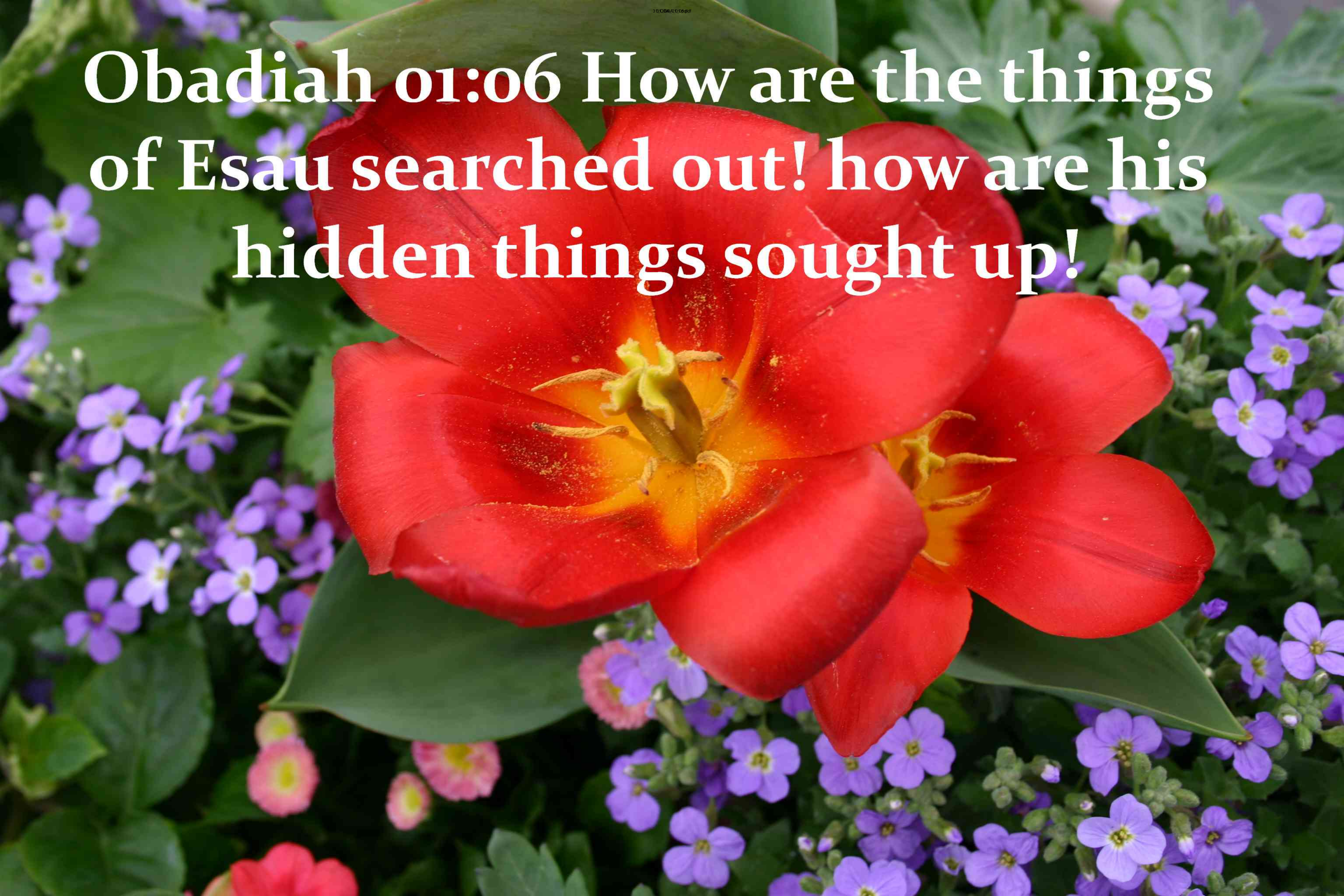
Obadiah 01:03 The pride of thine

bring me down to the ground?


Obadiah 01:04 Though thou exalt

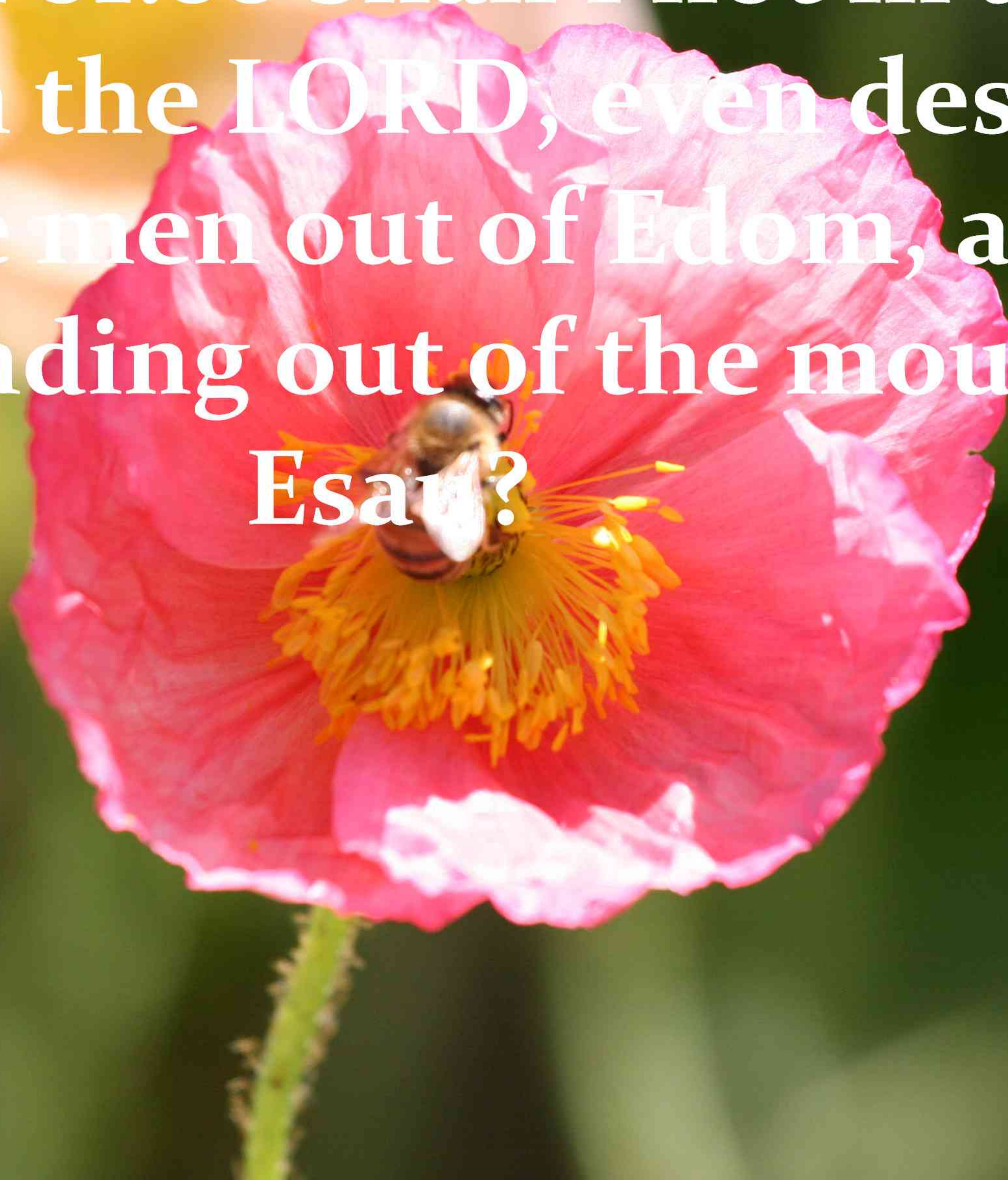
Obadiah 01:06 How are the things

hidden things sought up!






Obadiah 01:07 All the men of thy

Esau?




**Obadiah 01:09 And thy mighty

cut off for ever.




**Obadiah 01:11 In the day that thou


Obadiah 01:12 But thou shouldest


Obadiah 01:13 Thou shouldest not

day of their calamity;




Obadiah 01:14 Neither shouldst

remain in the day of distress.




Obadiah 01:15 For the day of the


Obadiah 01:17 But upon mount
