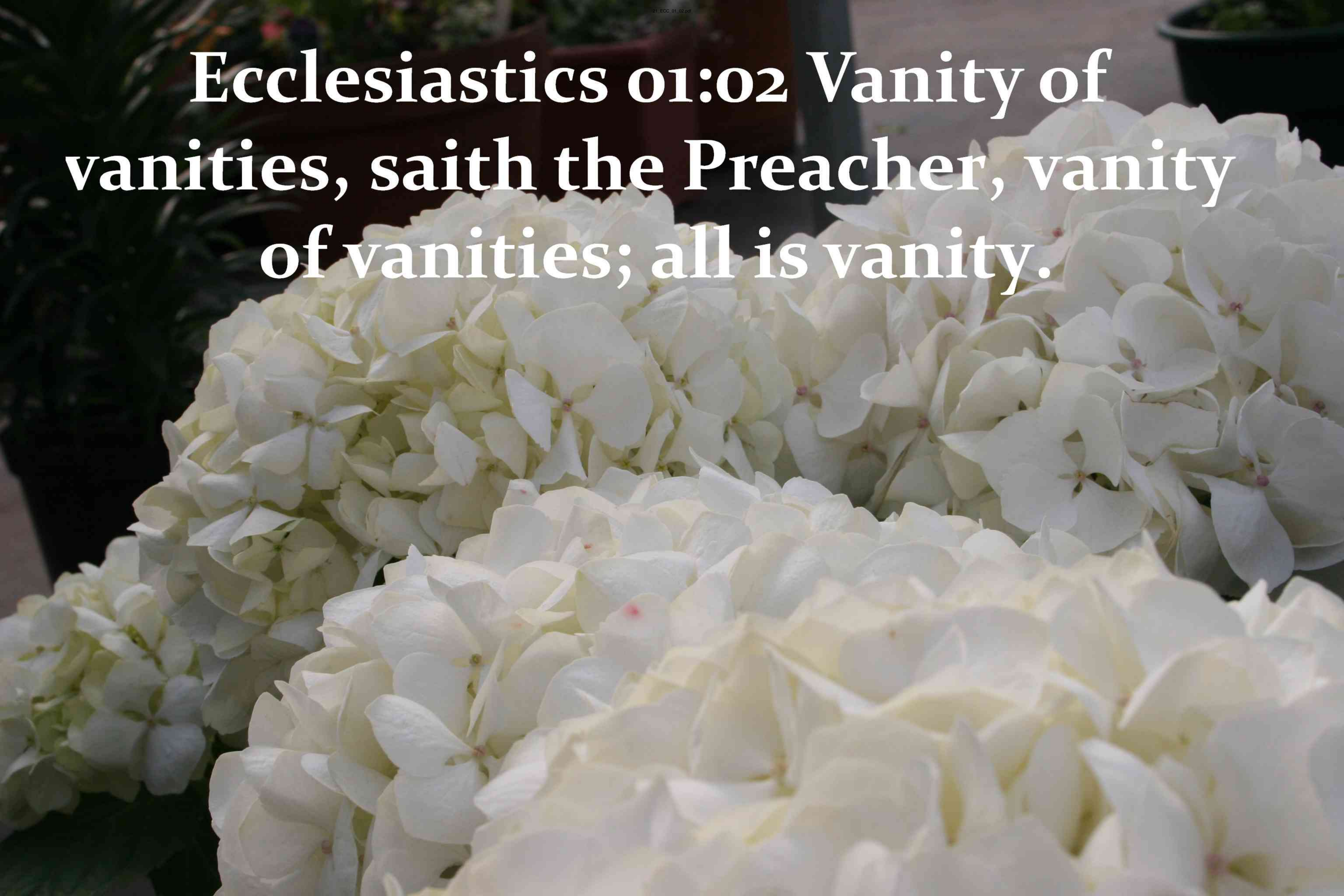

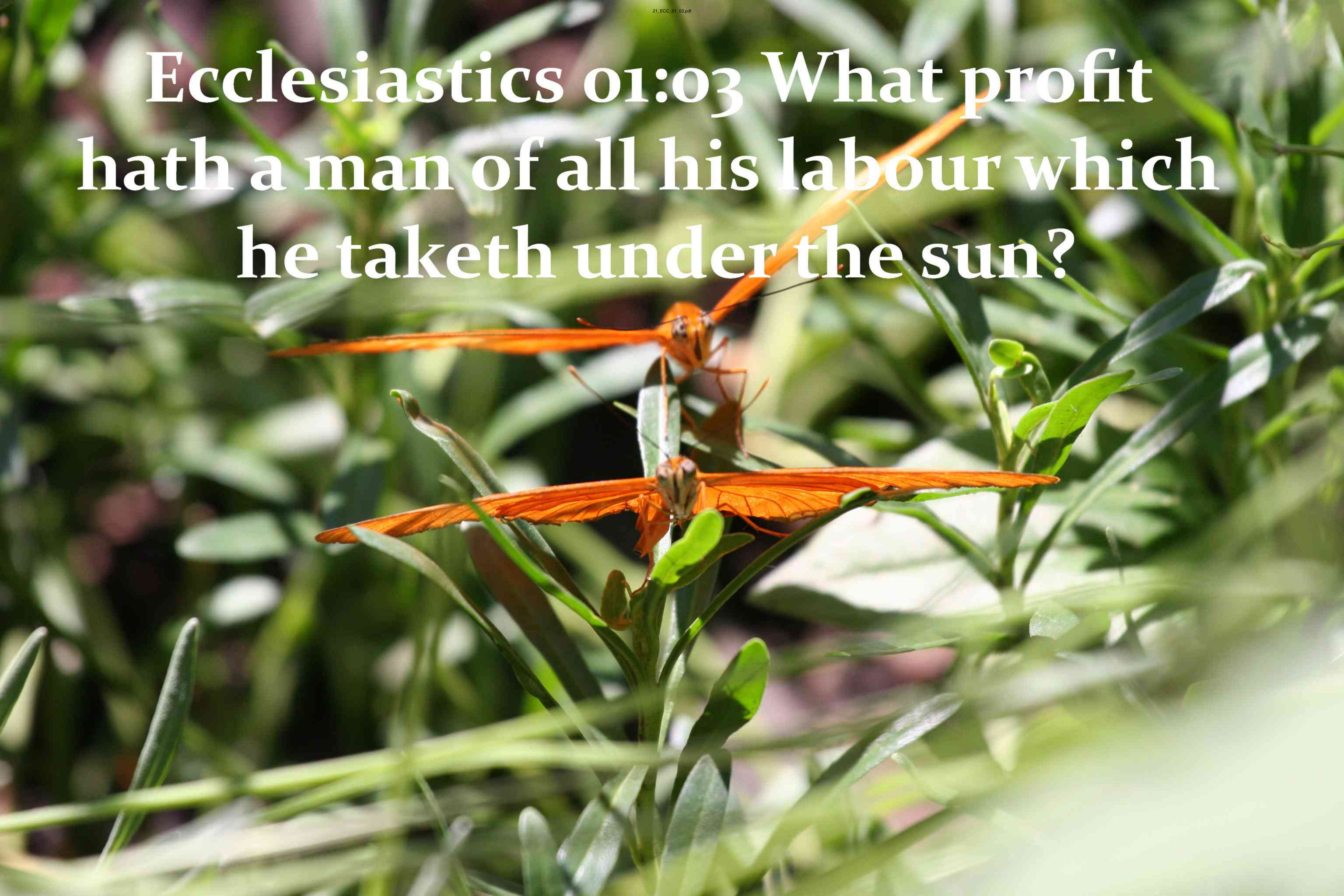
Ecclesiastics 01:01 The words of the

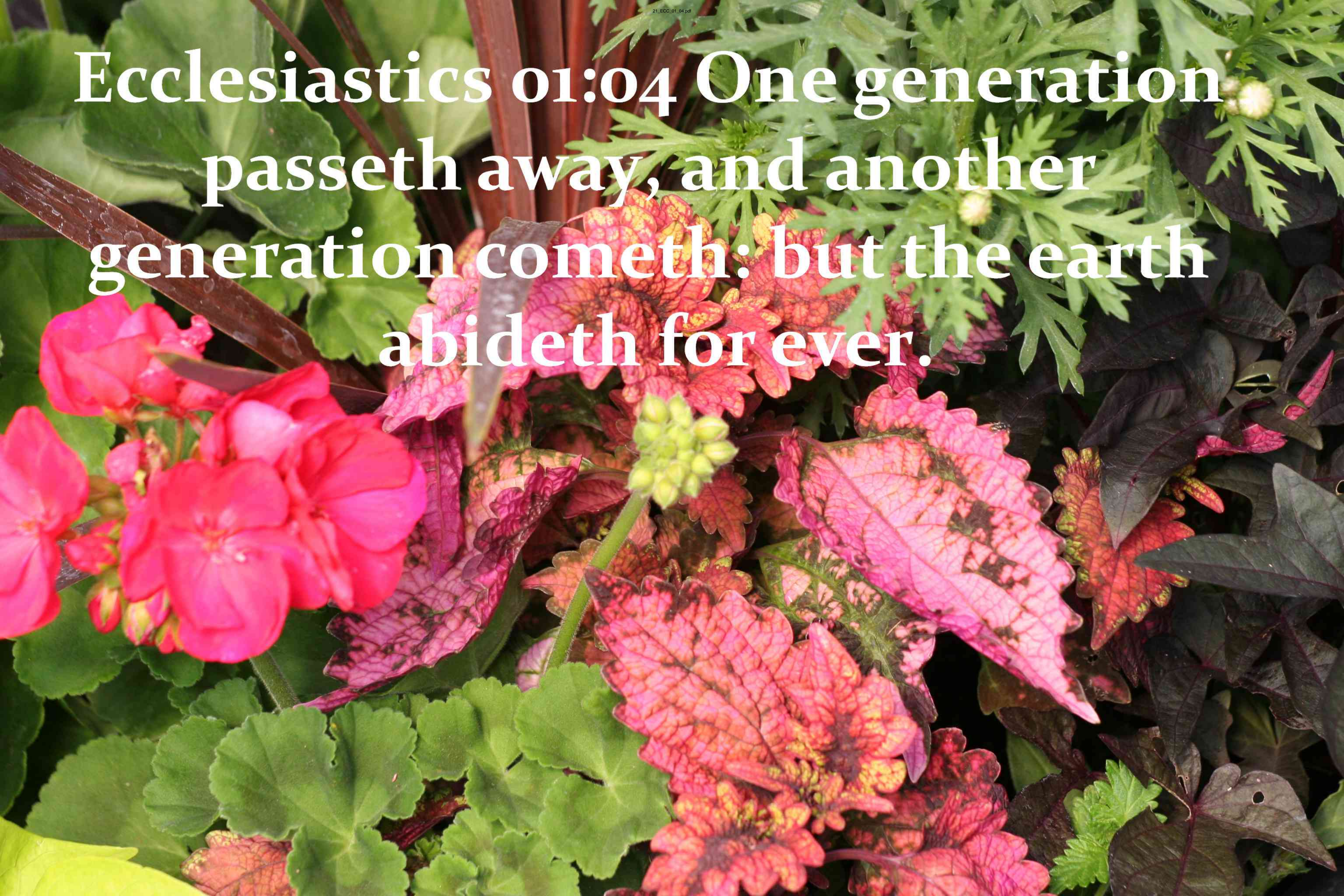

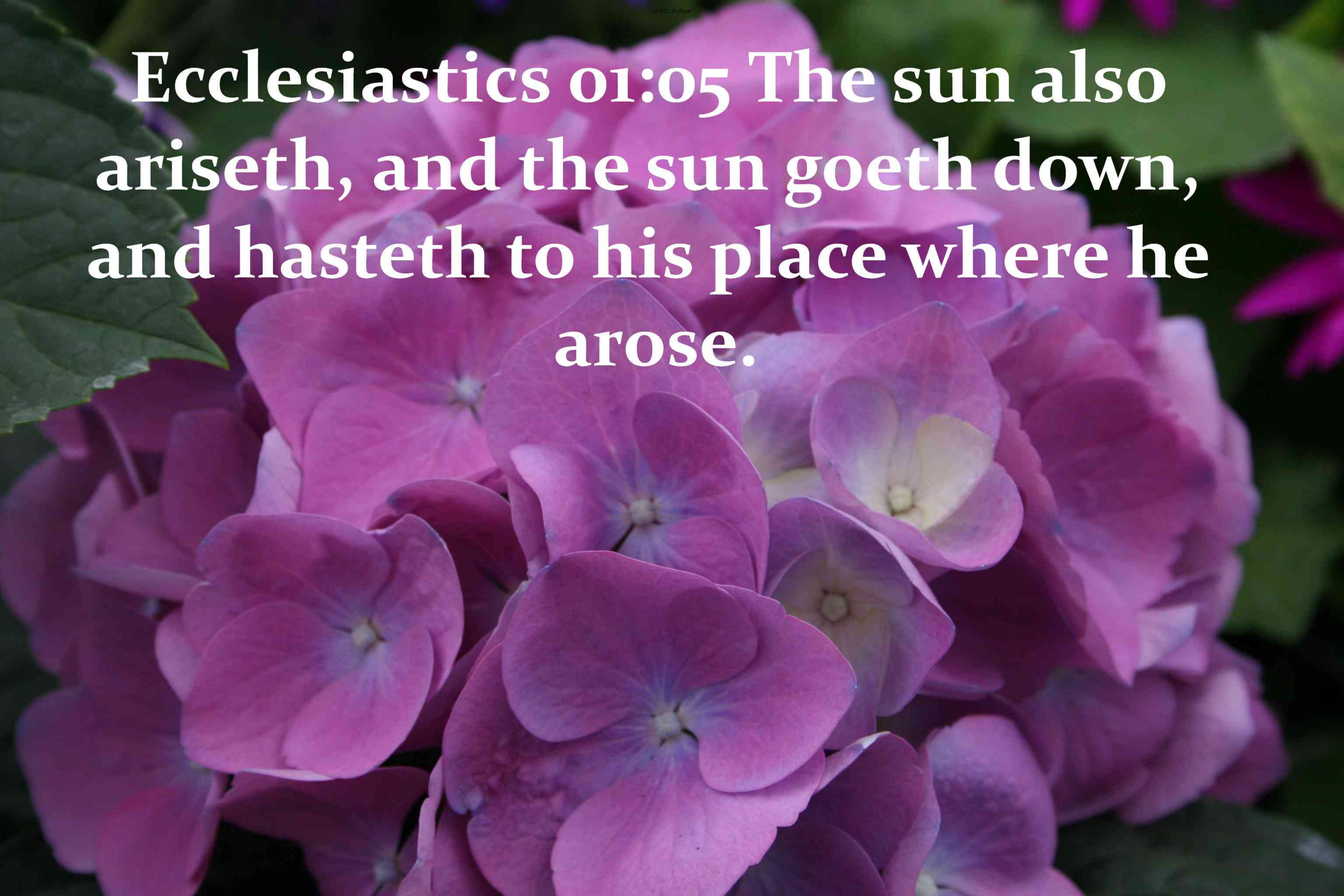




Ecclesiastics 01:04 One generation

arose.





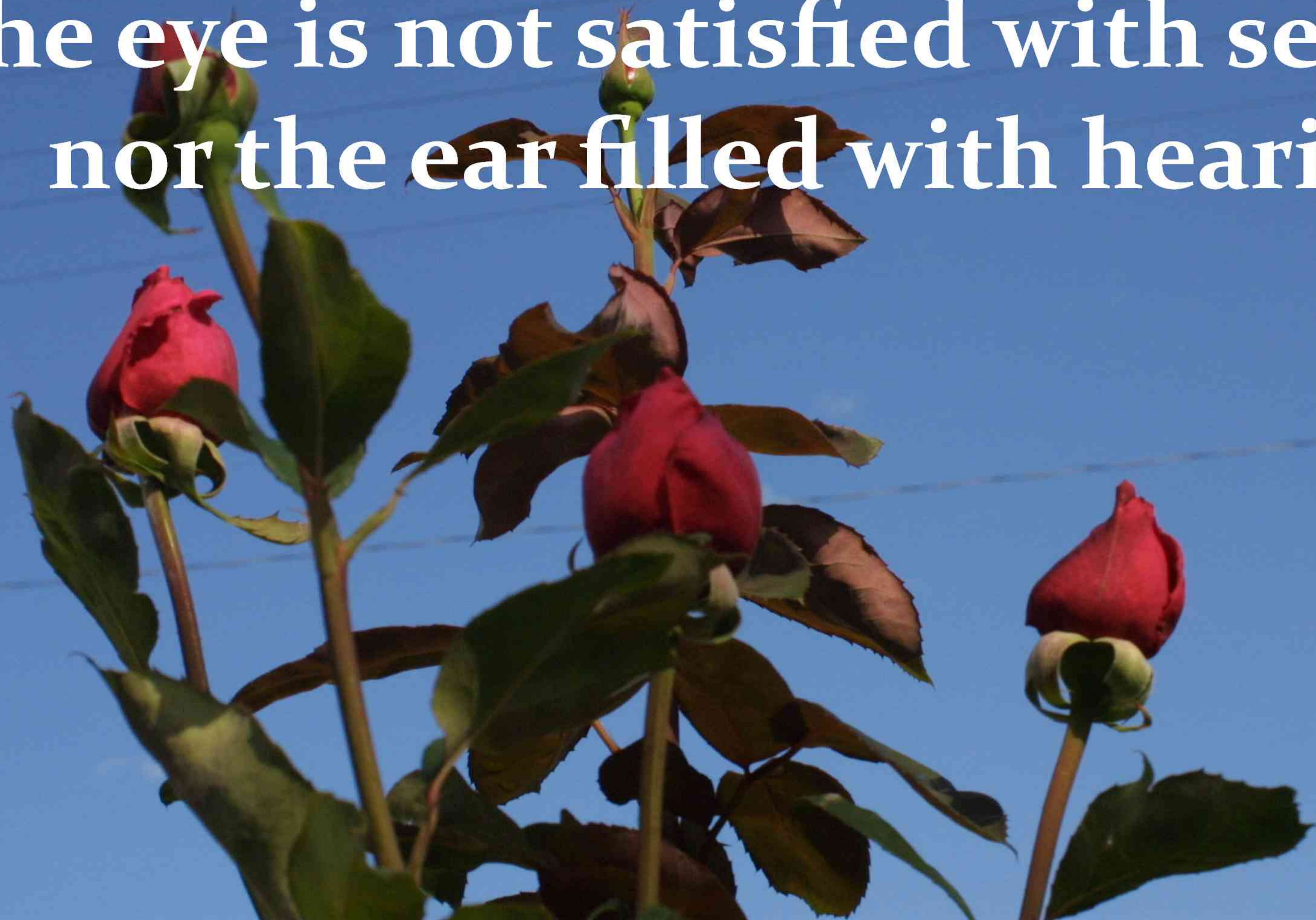
**Ecclesiastics 01:06 The wind goeth

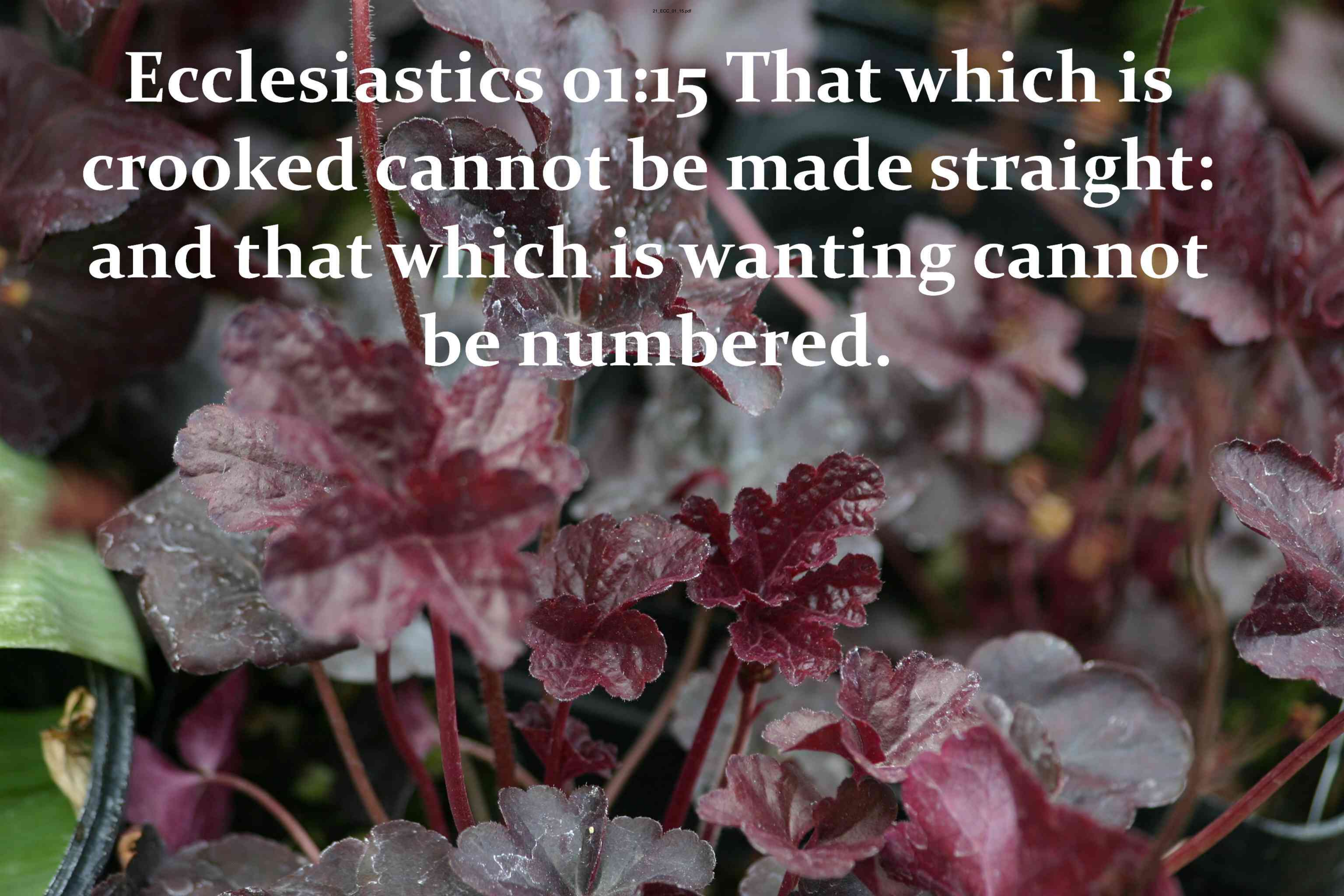

vexation of spirit.**



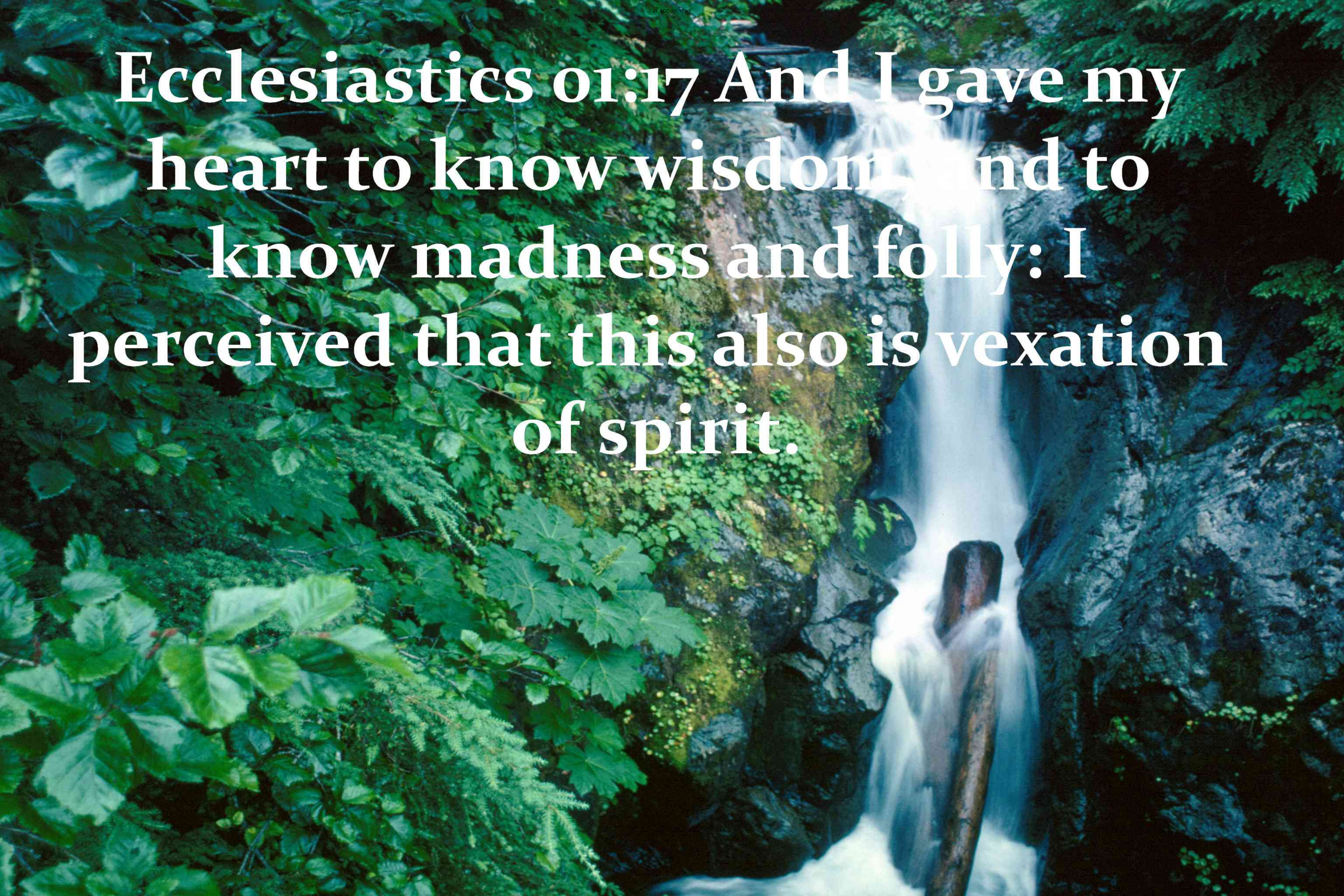
**Ecclesiastics 01:15 That which is
